The Project for Human Resource Development Scholarship by JDS was established by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines with the assistance of the Government of Japan in 2002. The objective of JDS is to support human resources development of the Philippines, targeting young officials, who are expected to be leaders of the country, and to engage in formulating and implementing social and economic development policies after return. Participants of the JDS Project shall contribute to an expanded and enhanced foundation for bilateral relations with Japan as persons having well-rounded knowledge of Japan.

Interested applicants must meet the following required qualifications:

- 1) A Filipino Citizen:
- 2) Between 22 and 39 years old as of April 1, 2017 (in principle):
- 3) Must be an official of target organizations and NOT a member of the military:
- 4) Currently employed in the Target organizations, has permanent status, has 2 years of work experience particularly in work relevant to the selected Component, at the time of application;
- 5) Has bachelor's degree relevant to the applying target fields;
- 6) Has a performance rating of at least "Very Satisfactory" from July 1. 2015 to June 30 2016 in the organization;
- 7) Has not been awarded foreign scholarship for Master's degree.

Note: For the applicants for the "prioritized slot for Bangsamoro", special qualification may be applied. Refer to the website for the details.


