2:00 PM - 3:00 PM	Strategy: Gallery Walk  *Gallery Walk is a learning strategy that allows participants to demonstrate, give and receive feedback from an audience, who are also creators of related outputs. As compared to traditional reporting, gallery walk gives more freedom to learners to inquire, investigate and explore items presented. This activity highlights learner choice and learner voice.  Overarching Principles: Learner Choice and Voice, Learning by Teaching
	This activity intends to provide participants a more reflective venue to gain mastery and deeper understanding of the previous experience (Mini Task 2), through conversations with fellow participants. Through exchange of ideas, reactions and suggestions, participants earn a wider view of how these tech tools are relevant to their functions as reference librarians.
	Mechanics: Each group will take turns in presenting their outputs. Facilitator(s) and other groups will provide assessment on the presentation. Critique will not be limited to the design of the e-learning applications but also to the functionality. The aim of this activity is to provide participants ways of improving their outputs.
